

Key Leaders in a Cub Scout Pack:

- 1 Cubmaster
- 1 or more den leaders
- 1 committee chair
- 2 or more committee members
- 1 chartered organization representative (can also be a committee member)

Den Leader

- * Lead weekly meetings of the den (6-8 boys of the same or similar grade level). Have parents help as appropriate.
- * Plan activities during den meetings and on one weekend per month based on advancement requirements
- * Recruit a parent to be the assistant den leader and a Boy Scout or Venturer to be the den chief
- * Communicate den and pack schedule to families

Cubmaster

- * Serve as the master of ceremonies for monthly pack meetings and special events
- * Manage den leaders in running their dens effectively
- * Along with the membership chair, manage the pack's recruitment efforts
- * As one of the key 3 leaders, manage online records and use the BeAScout system to promote the pack online

Committee Chair

- * Lead a team of 3 or more (ideally 6 or more) people who handle behind-the-scenes management of the pack
- * Lead monthly committee meetings
- * As one of the key 3 leaders, manage online records and use the BeAScout system to promote the pack online
- * Recruit parents or others to fill vacant committee positions

Chartered Organization Representative

- * Keep the chartered organization informed about how the pack is doing
- * Communicate to the pack opportunities to serve and participate with the organization
- * As one of the key 3 leaders, manage online records and use the BeAScout system to promote the pack online
- * On behalf of the executive officer (president, principal, bishop, pastor, etc.), approve or deny adult leaders

Committee Members

Possible positions: membership/recruitment chair, fundraising chair, advancement chair, secretary, treasurer, outdoor or camping chair
